Quality medical and dental care lays the groundwork for a healthy life. Regular check-ups, vaccinations, and treatments for chronic conditions help prevent future health issues and promote overall well-being. Dental care is equally crucial, as it prevents painful conditions and supports good nutrition and self-esteem. By prioritizing health, we empower children to focus on their education and personal growth.

Holistic Education Opens the Doors of Opportunity

Education serves as the cornerstone for a brighter future, particularly for children who have faced significant challenges and instability in their early years. Through education, they gain the knowledge and skills necessary to pursue a wide array of opportunities, breaking the cycle of poverty and disadvantage. At Haven of Hope Bolivia, a well-rounded education includes not only a traditional academic education at a private, Christian school but also daily spiritual preparation through devotions, Bible reading, church services and discipleship. Education also means learning to live in a family, sharing knowledge and other life skills.

Our education coordinator, Cyntia Aldana, is teaching our young people to share their skills by tutoring younger children as part of a reading and writing program. Not only do the young women learn leadership and early education teaching skills, they also form close connections with the younger generation of children at Haven of Hope who look up to them as role models.

Life skills are a crucial piece of preparing our children for independence. Teaching essential daily tasks such as budgeting, cooking, personal hygiene, and time management ensures that our children will be able to manage their lives effectively when it's time for them to transition into adulthood.

Training: Building Practical Competence

Beyond traditional academics, practical training equips our children with the competence needed for real-world situations. Vocational training in fields such as carpentry, sewing, or culinary arts provides them with a tangible skill set that can lead to immediate employment or entrepreneurship.

For example, at Haven of Hope Bolivia, sustainability programs such as carpentry and sewing not only teach valuable skills but also instill a sense of self-reliance and confidence. These programs are instrumental in helping children discover their talents and passions, guiding them toward fulfilling careers.

By investing in these areas, Haven of Hope Bolivia becomes an agent of transformation in the lives of children, providing them with the resources and support needed to overcome their past and build a promising future. Through education, training, and life skills, these children can emerge as empowered individuals ready to contribute positively to their communities.

And the care that HOHB gives extends beyond the walls of its campuses. Our social worker, Nelly Chambi, plays a vital role in this piece of our comprehensive care. She arranges visits between children on our campus and their siblings in other homes, visits young people who have aged out but still need extra support, and arranges meetings with family members of the children, both those who are interested in regaining custody and those who are unable to take on custody but want to be part of the children's lives.
